AVAILC = Percentage of students in each country answering "very easy" or "fairly easy" (6 point scale) to the question "How difficult do you thing it would be for you to get cannabis if

you wanted to"

PEERC = Percentage of students stating that "most" or "all" friends smoke

marijuana or hashish

CANPRICE = Average price of cannabis, € (not in ESPAD)

Individual-level variables

MALE = male gender

CIG = Smoked 10 or more cigarettes during lifetime

EVEN = going out in the evening (two and more times per month)
SKIPSCHOOL = Skipped school two or more times during the last 30 days

PEER = Most or all friends use cannabis SIBL = Older sibling smokes cannabis

RISK = Cannabis risk perception score constructed from three items after factor analysis. For example "How much do you think people risk harming themselves, if they smoke marijuana or hashish regularly" s
