**Working title of the publication** Drinking pattern and fights after drinking among adolescents: a comparative analysis

**Research question(s)** The assumption of that the variation in drinking patterns in different cultures would affect the association between alcohol and violence is verified in studies at the aggregate level. In the present study the aim is to assess to which extend this could be found also at the individual level, that is if a stronger association between alcohol consumption and violence would be found in countries with a explosive drinking pattern.
