Working title of the publication THE EFFECTS OF PERCEIVED AVAILABILITY OF DIFFERENT ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON YOUNG PEOPLE' S DRINKING IN EUROPE: A COMPARATIVE EXPLORATION

Research question(s) a) Do the perceived availability of various types of alcoholic beverages relate to the purchase and to the minimum legal age of that particular alcoholic beverage? b) Do the perceived availability of various types of alcoholic beverages relate to the prevalence of drinking and to the minimum age of that particular alcoholic beverage? c) Does the highest perceived availability relate to the prevalence of drinking any alcoholic beverage and to the lowest minimum legal age? d) Does the highest perceived availability relate to the prevalence of intoxication and to the lowest minimum legal age?

Variables to be included in the analysis The perceived availability (very easy or fairly easy) of beer, wine and spirits and the highest perceived availability (very easy or fairly easy) of beer wine

or spirits, the minimum age limit to purchase beer, wine and spirits, and the lowest minimum age limit to purchase beer, wine or spirits, the purchase of beer, wine and spirits in a store for own consumption at least one time during the previous 30 days, prevalence of drinking beer, wine and spirits at least on one occasion during the previous 30 days, prevalence of drinking any alcoholic beverage at least on one occasion during the previous 30 days and prevalence of intoxication at least on one occasion during the previous 30 day and parents' knowledge where on Saturday nights.
